2. <u>Conditional Use Permit File #25-C04, Review Of Proposed Pilates Studio In The Claremont Packing House Located At 532 West First Street, Unit #212 – Applicant – Judy Cantre.</u>

Director Johnson introduced Planning Intern, Talia Markison.

Planning Intern Markison presented a PowerPoint presentation and addressed Commissioners' inquiries regarding potential interior/exterior signage, past unit usage, Packing House master sign program, adequacy of air conditioning, and noise disturbance level.

Judy Cantre, Applicant, confirmed that there will be five reformers, a maximum of six people, and that the facility's air conditioning is adequate.

Chair Emerson invited public comment.

Commissioner Rosenbluth stated that this is a reasonable use and the findings can be made. He proposed amending Section 3K to include "the existing sign program for the Packing House".

Commissioner Davis agrees with the amendment to Section 3K.

Commissioner Williamson supports the revision and appreciates the video.

Vice Chair Rahmim approves the project and concurs with Commissioner Rosenbluth.

Applicant – Stepsell LLC.

Assistant Planner Kim presented a PowerPoint presentation and addressed the Commissioners' inquiries regarding table/seating arrangement, potential exterior use, consistency of closing hours with the surrounding restaurants, ADA accessibility, grill, food waste composting, and the categorization of sake according to the Alcoholic Beverage Control.

Tri Le, Applicant, stated that he's been in the restaurant business for ten years, eight of which have been in Claremont. He is excited to be a business owner and to bring the Izakaya concept to Claremont. The five-foot hood will be over the four-foot gas grill.

APPLICANT – STEPSELL LLC as amended to include compliance with the existing building sign program (Section 3J) and "beer and wine" to replace "full line of alcoholic beverages" (Section 3M); and find this item is exempt from environmental review under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA).
