SUBJECT: RESULTS OF 2026-28 CITY COUNCIL PRIORITIES SURVEY

Late last year, the City began a public engagement campaign to gather community feedback on City Council Priorities for the next two years (July 1, 2026 through June 30, 2028). The City hired Jacob Green & Associates to facilitate two community forums and a City Council Priorities Workshop. The first community forum was held in-person at the Hughes Center on January 7, where approximately 45 people were in attendance. The second community forum will be held virtually this Wednesday, January 14. The City Council Priorities Workshop will be held on January 31 in the Council Chamber.

The City also opened a community survey on December 4, 2025 that asked participants for their opinions on City programs and services, priorities for the City Council, and suggestions for improving the City. The survey closed on January 8, 2026. At the close of the survey, 938 participants completed the survey. A summary of the results is attached to this memo. All community input that is received will be shared with the City Council prior to its Priorities Workshop and all comments, including this memo, will be published with the corresponding meeting agenda.

Information on how to provide written feedback and/or participate in the 2026-28 Priorities Setting Process is being advertised as follows:

- An article was published in the December City Letter, which was mailed to all households, businesses, P.O. Boxes, and apartment complexes in Claremont.
- Over several weeks, articles were published in the City Manager's Weekly E-Newsletter. Additionally, a direct email containing information on the Priorities Setting Process was sent to the over 1,400 email addresses that subscribe to the newsletter.



























Q17 Emergency Preparedness (i.e., Prepare Residents, Businesses, and City Employees for Response to Natural Disasters and Other Emergency Situations)



Q18 Historic Preservation (i.e., Preservation and Conservation of Buildings, Landmarks, and other Objects of Historical Importance)





Q20 Investment in Technology (i.e., Utilizing Technology for Communicating with and Serving the Public)



Q21 Land Use, Planning, and Zoning (i.e., Development/Projects, Economic Development, Architectural Review)



Q22 Unhoused/Homelessness Issues



Q23 Police and Public Safety



Q24 Recreational Opportunities (i.e., Youth Programs, Senior Services, Recreation Classes, Special Events)



Q25 Transportation and Mobility (i.e., Public Transit, Alternative Modes of Transportation, Traffic Calming Measures)









Q31 Fiscal Responsibility


